Subject: Supplemental waiver information

As we discussed on the call last week we have conducted a survey of the counties to request additional information. Although not all counties have responded, we are providing a brief summary of the results today and will continue to provide updated information as we receive it from the counties.

We asked the counties whether they were confident they could meet the 45-day deadline. 37 of 64 counties have responded so far. Regardless of whether the responding counties determined they could get ballots printed in time to meet the 45-day deadline, every county felt they could meet the deadline with at least either a vendor proof or SWAB. The responding counties that stated they feel confident they will be able to get ballots printed in time to meet the 45-day deadline generally represent the counties with the larger populations of UOCAVA voters.

The specific breakdown of whether responding counties felt they could get ballots printed in time is as follows:

. Of the counties who have responded, 35% stated they feel confident they will be able to mail regular ballots to meet the deadline.

. 46% stated they felt confident that they could mail regular ballots between 35-42 days prior to the election, and a vendor proof or SWAB could be used to meet the 45-day deadline.

. The remaining 19% stated they did not feel confident they would get ballots printed in time to mail earlier than 30 days prior to the election, but that a vendor proof or SWAB could be used to meet the 45-day deadline.

We asked counties approximately how many fax/email transmission requests have been received. Responding counties stated that about 900 requests for fax and about 500 requests for email have been received so far. All responding counties indicated they anticipate additional requests in the next several weeks.

We will continue to provide updated information next week as the remaining counties respond to the survey. In the meantime, please email or give us a call with any questions.
