Dear Ms. Burgess:

This is in response to your August 11, 2010 email. Our assumption is that you merely wish to reconfirm information as it is our understanding that we previously provided your office this information. Below are your questions and our responses.

1. The "no later than" DATE that the complete ballot will be sent to UOCAVA voters.

The Office of Elections will receive the ballots for UOCAVA from the vendor and then provide them to the counties no later than the 36th day prior to the General Election (i.e. September 27, 2010). The counties will then mail out the ballots no later than the 35th day prior to the General Election (i.e. September 28, 2010)

2. The DATE that ballots must be received by in order to be counted for the 2010 General Election.

Ballots must be received by the close of polls which is 6:00 p.m. on election day. As such, the date is November 2, 2010 by 6:00 p.m.

3. Does the State of Hawaii allow for the transmission of ballots via email? Via fax?

We permit the transmission of blank ballots to the voter by email, fax, and mail. Fax is permitted only during last week as per HRS Chapter 15, but not earlier. Email and mail may be done anytime.

4. Does the State of Hawaii allow the return of ballots via email? Via fax?

Voted ballots may be returned by mail and fax. We do not permit the return of voted ballots by email. Technically, fax returns may be done only in the last week. Instructions for our emailed ballots indicate that they should be returned by mail.

5. Does the State of Hawaii provide on-line posting of ballots?

As we understand your question, the answer is no.

6. Does the State of Hawaii allow on-line return of ballots? (Ballots can be accessed, voted, and returned using an on-line entity)
