In Washington, only ballots returned by postal mail or in person are valid. Ballots returned by facsimile, email or online require receipt of the original ballot before they can be counted. As a result, some counties only reported ballots received by Postal Mail.

A total of 20,619 ballots were received and counted. Only 22 arrived too late. Another 258 were rejected for other reasons such as unsigned ballots, ballot signature did not match voter registration, or the original ballot was not received.

The information provided on this form is certified by the Secretary of State, State of Washington to be true and representative of the total number ballots received from UOCAVA voters during the 2010 General Election.
