Get Ready

You will need:

- Blue or black pen
- Clear tape (optional)

Your MyBallot Packet will include:

- Your Ballot (X pages)
- Oath & Signature
- Privacy Sheet
- Pre-printed Envelope

1 Print your MyBallot Packet

Print all pages.

2 Vote your Ballot


Follow the instructions on the ballot.

3 Complete the Oath & Signature

Sign and date that you have reviewed the oath.

4 Prepare your MyBallot Packet

Arrange your completed MyBallot Packet in the order at right.



5 Submit your MyBallot Packet

Submit on or before
Election Day:

Tuesday, November 2, 2010

Option 1: By mail, with proper postage

Insert your MyBallot Packet into an envelope, affix proper postage, and mail (address is below).

Option 2: By mail, postage paid

Locate the Pre-Printed Envelope that printed with your MyBallot Packet and follow instructions to construct the envelope around your MyBallot Packet.

Option 3: Electronically, and then mail

1. Scan your completed MyBallot Packet
2. Fax or email to your County Elections Office (information is below)
3. Mail your completed MyBallot Packet
4. Your Ballot will count if your mailed MyBallot Packet arrives before Election Certification Day


How to vote



Use a dark blue or black pen to completely fill in the box to the left of your choice.

Vote for one in each race. If you vote for more than one, no votes will be counted for that race.

If you make a mistake



Draw a line through the entire measure response or candidate's name. Then you may make another choice.

Optional write-in



To vote for a candidate not listed for that race, fill in the box to the left of "write-in" and print the name on the dashed line.

Read the oath

I do solemnly swear or affirm under penalty of perjury that I am:

- A citizen of the United States;
- A legal resident of the state of Washington;
- At least 18 years old on election day;
- Voting only once in this election;
- Not ineligible to vote due to a felony conviction; and
- Not disqualified from voting due to a court order.

It is illegal to forge a signature or cast another person's ballot.

Attempting to vote when not qualified, attempting to vote more than once, or falsely signing this oath is a felony punishable by a maximum imprisonment of five years, a maximum fine of \$10,000, or both.

! For your ballot to count we must have your signature

Optional: If you cannot sign

Try to sign or mark in the "signature of voter" area in the presence of two witnesses.

The two witnesses should then sign at right.
