Subject: Follow-up Actions Related to the Approval of the State of Washington’s MOVE Act Waiver Request under Section 102 (g)(2) of UOCAVA for the November 2, 2010 Federal General Election

On August 27, 2010, the State of Washington’s application for a MOVE Act waiver request under Section 102 (g)(2) of the UOCAVA for the November 2, 2010 Federal General Election was approved.

The waiver approval laid out a number of reporting requirements for Washington. The table below provides additional guidance on meeting those requirements.
