ALEXANDRIA, Va. – The redesign of the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) (SF-76) is nearly complete. Thanks to all those who commented on both the content and design of the draft form during the 60-day comment period. Your feedback helped optimize usability and intuitiveness.
