Pennsylvania Primary Election on May 20

Pennsylvania will hold its primary election on May 20. If you are a Pennsylvania resident and want to vote in the primary, you must be registered by April 21. If you live outside Pennsylvania and need to register to vote absentee, you can do so using the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) available at FVAP.gov. If you complete and return this form, Pennsylvania will register you as an absentee voter and send you your ballot for all elections this year.

If you are already registered in Pennsylvania, you must request your ballot by May 19 if you want to vote in the primary.

Detailed information is available at the following website: fvap.gov/pennsylvania, along with the FPCA. If you are registered and have not received your absentee ballot by April 20, use the Federal Write-In Absentee Ballot (FWAB) to vote. The form is also available at fvap.gov/pennsylvania.
