NEW ONLINE GUIDED TRAINING AND RESOURCES NOW AVAILABLE FOR ELECTION OFFICIALS

FVAP launches interactive training on military and overseas absentee voting

June 11, 2012 — The Federal Voting Assistance Program (FVAP) is pleased to announce the launch of its interactive Election Official Guided Training in addition to a series of educational and reference materials for election officials interested in learning more about the military and overseas absentee voting process. These resources were developed to help ensure citizens covered by the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA) who want to vote are afforded the same opportunity as the general population.

The 35-minute *Election Official Guided Training* is designed for election officials unfamiliar with UOCAVA or those seasoned election officials needing a refresher course. The courseware introduces the law, its requirements and forms, and provides a sense of the challenges that military and overseas voters face along with suggestions on how your role as an election official can further assist the UOCAVA population.
