DC Primary Election on April 1

The District of Columbia will hold its primary election on April 1. If you are a DC resident and want to vote in the primary, you must be registered by March 3. If you live outside the DC area and need to register to vote absentee, you can do so using the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) at FVAP.gov. If you complete and return this form, DC will register you as an absentee voter and send you your ballot for any elections this year.

If you are already registered in DC, you must request your ballot by March 25 if you want to vote in the primary.

If you are registered and have not received your absentee ballot by March 3, use the Federal Write-In Ballot to vote. The form is also available at fvap.gov/district-of-columbia. **You are receiving this notice as your military personnel records indicate you are a resident of this State. Pursuant to Federal law you will receive these notices for each upcoming Federal election in your State.
